
About Our Almanac:

Rules and Regulations

- The school requests for support and co-operation from the parents and guardians in all academic and other matters concerning their child, in order to maintain discipline.
- Parents are requested to read the almanac every evening and see to it that the lessons and homework assigned for the next day are completed by the child.
- Parents are requested to take note of the remarks made in the almanac by the Principal or the teacher and counter sign against the same.
- Parents should ensure that they follow the school almanac and avoid taking their children out for social functions, gatherings, trips and vacations during school days.
- Parents should avoid criticism of teachers or the school on any platform including social media or in front of their children as this can result in the students losing their respect towards teachers and the school. In case of any grievance or problem parents are advised to contact the school staff or Principal.
- Parents should not distribute or announce invitations to birthdays or other events ' to other students in the school premises.
- Parents should not give any gifts or sweets to any of the staff members.
- Parents are encouraged to donate books to the school library instead of distributing sweets on the occasion of their children's birthday.
- Parents are requested to note that good care will be taken of the students on the campus and during school outings. However, in case of an accident, if an untoward injury or occurrence takes place inside the school premises or during field trips, the Institution, School Management, Director or any staff member would not be held responsible for the same, wholly or partially, individually or jointly.
- Parents are requested to note that names and photos of their children may be used for communication purposes by the school in media such as the school website, social media, brochures, pamphlets, souvenir, etc.
- Any written correspondence to the school should be addressed to the Principal. The full name of the student, along with the class and section should be mentioned.
- Parents are requested to note that the school reserves the right to change the rules and regulations from time to time. The same will be communicated to the parents through reliable channels.
- Parents should submit requests for bonafide certificates/ NOC, if required, at least 15 days in advance, and for recommendation letters, if any, while applying to colleges overseas, at least a month in advance to the school office.

Admissions and Withdrawals:

A child is admitted to the school only after completion of the entire admission procedure, which includes the interaction, submission of required documents (Birth Certificate, etc.) and payment of the required fees.

- If a child has attended any other school in the past, parents should provide the School Leaving Certificate from the previous school (which should be a recognized one), for admission to MITVGS.
- After confirmation of the child's admission, if the parent wishes to withdraw the child from the school, fees once paid will not be refunded, except for the security deposit. This is irrespective of whether or not the child has attended any classes in the school.
- Long Absence from school without prior approval by the Principal will result in the student's name being struck off from the school rolls. In such a case, readmission to the school will attract the relevant fee applicable.
- A 90 days' notice must be submitted in writing to the Principal for the withdrawal of a child.
- If the withdrawal is during the preceding term / installment, an application should be submitted three months in advance or fees for the next three months should be paid. Fees already paid will not be refunded.
- If withdrawal is happening at the end of the academic session, an application should be submitted on or before 31st January of the ongoing academic session or fees for the first term / installment of the next academic session should be paid.
- Withdrawal application should be submitted in the prescribed form. Transfer Certificate and other documents required from the school, should be applied for in writing 15 days in advance. School Leaving Certificate will not be issued until the parents have cleared all dues as prescribed in the fee rules.

Code of Conduct for Students:

- Students should reach the school on time every day. Students are expected to be on time for the assembly. Regular attendance and punctuality are emphasised upon. Students who come in late will have to procure a permit slip from the Principal before entering class. Habitual late comers will not be permitted to attend classes.
- Students are expected to report to school in complete, neatly ironed and clean School Uniform. Shirts should be tucked in neatly inside the shorts/skirts. Students are not allowed to change their clothes or shoes in the school without specific permission from the class teacher.
- Nails to be pared and cleaned and hair should be neatly combed.
- Shoes to be polished, cleaned and worn with the prescribed socks.

- Only simple black hairbands or clips are permitted. Wearing jewellery; colouring the hair; and applying henna, tattoos, nail polish, lipstick and other accessories in the school is not permitted. This is done so as to encourage simplicity among students and ensure uniformity. A pair of studs may be worn to school.
- Care should be taken that no part of the school property, including library books and computers in the lab, are damaged or lost. Students should ensure that they keep the school and its premises clean. Any cost of replacement due to any loss or damage will have to be borne by the concerned parents. They should also cooperate with all concerned staff members to maintain order and discipline.
- Students should carry the almanac with them daily and the relevant books and note books, according to the schedule. Parents' signature should be obtained in the diary or any other document whenever required.
- Bags, cardigans, shoes and other articles brought to school, should have the student's name and class marked on them. Any unclaimed articles found on the premises may be handed over to the reception. Students should take good care of their belongings. The school will not be responsible for money, valuables or articles lost or stolen in the school premises. Students are expected to take responsibility of their belongings.
- Students are strictly prohibited from bringing mobile phones to the school. Students found using mobile phones on the premises will be held accountable for the same and the phone will be confiscated.
- Students are prohibited from bringing cameras, CDs, any kind of music players, slam books, picture magazines, comics, video games and audio tapes to the school. They should also not bring fancy watches and other accessories to the school.
- Students are not allowed to receive any visitors in the school. They are also not allowed to make or attend phone calls from the school, unless the management deems it to be necessary.
- Students are discouraged from offering gifts to their teachers, except in those cases sanctioned by the Principal.
- Students should be polite to fellow students and the staff, should not harm others and should use decent language only.
- Students should obey the teachers and other staff members and follow the rules laid down by the school.
- Students should eat only during the designated short break and lunch time.
- Only vegetarian food is allowed on the campus.
- Students should help their juniors and peers as and when instructed.
- Although parents are responsible for the behaviour of their children outside the campus, the school will take necessary action when such behaviour is reported to be immoral or violent.

Discipline Policy:

A: The following acts and conduct on the part of the students will amount to misconduct:

- i) Misbehaviour towards teachers or any other employee of the school.
- ii) Intentional disturbance of classes.
- iii) Absence from classes without the permission of the teacher / Vice-Principal / Principal.
- iv) Bullying / intimidating others.
- v) Damaging/ disfiguring school property.
- vi) Association with banned organizations.
- vii) Propagating communal/ caste feeling among students.
- viii) Eve-teasing / misbehaviour towards girl students.
- ix) Propagating a strike/ disruption.
- x) Indulging in acts of moral turpitude.
- xi) Disobeying lawful orders of the teachers/ Principal.
- xii) Bringing unauthorized people/ articles/ instruments.
- xiii) Theft/Pilferage of school/ student's property.
- xiv) Any behaviour unbecoming of a student.
- xv) When students move along the corridors and when changing class, they must maintain silence and walk in a single line keeping left.
- xvi) Students are expected to speak only English during and outside the class except for other language period.

B: In case of misconduct, school shall take action as per observation, which may involve:

1. Oral warning to the student.
2. Written warnings.
3. Suspension of one day from classes / school / period / after five written warnings.
4. Final Written warning in case of no improvement.
5. Suspension of one week.

A student may be expelled from the school in the following situations

- Continuous non-payment of school fees and additional charges by parents from time to time
- Consistent unsatisfactory progress for two consecutive years
- Immorality
- Any word or action of parents or the student that is likely to undermine the reputation of the Institution
- Damage to the school property

- Bullying, assaulting and ragging in any form
- Stealing is a serious offence and any pupil found stealing will be severely dealt with
- Misconduct of any sort inside or outside the campus will not be tolerated
- Misbehaviour with any staff member

Leave Policy:

- Students need to provide a leave note duly signed by the parents in case they are absent. Medical certificates must always be produced for illness exceeding one week.
- Students will not be exempted from attending physical education sessions or games, unless a valid doctor's certificate, accompanied by the parent's appeal is submitted to and approved by the Principal.
- If a student needs to leave the campus during school hours, s/he must get a written note from the Principal and the class teacher. No student is allowed to leave the school premises unless accompanied by a parent/guardian.
- Students should abide by the number of holidays and vacations allocated by the school and not prolong the same, unless there is some urgent need. Attendance on the opening day and closing day of every term is compulsory.
- A student's name will be struck off the school rolls in case of unaccounted absence from school, and re-admission will be required in such a case.
- Leave application for serious sickness or other crucial need, must reach the school office within 2 working days of the diagnosis.
- Students suffering from an infectious disease must produce a medical certificate from a registered medical practitioner, so that they may be allowed to attend the school without risk of communicating the infection to others.

Students' Assessment:

Students of grades I to X will be assessed after every unit that is completed in the class. As a part of this ongoing assessment, they will be provided a consolidated worksheet periodically.

- Absence of students from assessments is strictly discouraged and only genuine cases based on medical grounds will be considered.
- Promotion to the higher class is decided on the basis of such continuous assessment.
- Cheating, copying, helping other students or any other malpractice during the examination for any subject disqualifies the student for the examinations of all subjects.

- If a holiday is declared on the scheduled day of an examination, the same will be conducted after all other examinations are over.
- Progress report will be published after the mid-term and final examinations on the Open House Day or during the Parents Teacher Meeting (PTM).
- Absence of students or parents on Open House Day will result in the progress report being retained till a future date, which will be intimated to the concerned parents.

Resource Centre/Library Rules:

- The school's Resource Centre is open to all students from Class I onwards. All classes have one Resource Centre period per week. Students visiting the Resource Centre have to observe the following rules:
- Every student shall borrow and read books from the Resource Centre each month, as per activities listed in the schedule.
- Until the previously issued book is returned, students will not be eligible for a fresh issue.
- Reference books are not for issue. These books can be read only in the Resource Centre.
- If books are returned late without a valid reason, the borrowing facility will be withdrawn for a period of 4 weeks or more.
- Books marked, disfigured, damaged or lost while in their possession will have to be replaced by the borrower, failing which their parents will be billed the cost of a replacement.
- Any student found deliberately damaging or defacing a book may be debarred from the Resource centre for the entire term or academic year and a fine will be levied.
- The Resource Centre has an open access system, and the students must help maintain the order and organization of the collection in different shelves. They must place the books in the shelves strictly according to the call numbers, after consultation with the librarian.
- Students are not allowed to bring their personal books or belongings to the Resource Centre.
- Strict discipline has to be maintained in the Resource Centre.
- It is mandatory for all the students to do the activities slated in the list of activities of the resource centre.

Extracurricular & Co-curricular Activities:

The school conducts a range of additional activities for the all-round development of students. Various clubs run by the school cater to the varying interests and aptitude of children. It is compulsory that every student should get involved in at least one club of their choice that are presently run by the school.

The reading habit is on the decline. Even if it is necessary to be well-versed with the use of computers for study and communication, the state-of-the-art library and computer lab are two significant assets of the school. It is expected that students use these facilities to the fullest to improve their knowledge. Other such activities include hands-on natural farming, Student Parliament, Junior Robocon, dance, drama, visual arts, etc.

Physical Education:

It is necessary that children develop mental as well as physical capabilities in their formative years. An array of excellent sports facilities is provided by the school, which include cricket, tennis, badminton, basketball, hockey and football. Quality sports training is ensured by professional trainers appointed by the school. Such physical activities are an integral part of the academic program. Every child gets an opportunity to participate and learn various sports and athletic activities.

House System:

Students are categorized into various Houses in the school. This is to nurture healthy competition among them through various Inter-House activities that are carried throughout the year. Following are the four Houses and the colours associated with them.

- **Vipula House: Red**
- **Perna House: Blue**
- **Daksha House: Green**
- **Pragya House: Yellow**

Transfer Certificate:

All applications for Transfer Certificate (TC) should be sent as written requests to the Principal on or before the notice date.

- The school office will require 15 days to prepare the TC.
- Once a TC has been prepared and issued by the school, if the student wishes to revoke the same, the same will be treated as new admission. This will involve full payment of all fees applicable at that point. However, if a timely request is sent before the TC is ready, re-admission will be granted on the old admission number.
- TC is issued only after all school dues are cleared. Payments of school dues at the time of withdrawal of the student, will be accepted only in cash or demand draft.

Fee:

- Fee is charged for the complete year.
- The institute may raise the fees from time to time as per state norms.
- Fees once paid will not be refunded under any circumstances.
- In case the fee has not been paid on or before the due date a penalty of Rs.100/per week shall be paid by the parent along with the fee dues.
- Fees shall be paid by Demand draft or RTGS / NEFT. For further details contact the school office.
- Any other fee other than the tuition fee shall be paid separately by the parents.

Transport (If Applicable)

Students can avail transport facility, subject to the availability of seats. The school does not entertain request of any change in the bus route to suit the individual's convenience. Change of bus stop for a day or a week is not entertained. Availing the bus facility is not mandatory.

1. Students are expected to be on the right side of the bus stop at least five minutes prior to the arrival of the bus.
2. The buses will not wait for late comers.
3. The children should stay away from the main road until the bus arrives.
4. No student should come near the entry door of the bus unless it has made a complete stop.
5. The drivers are authorized to stop buses at the designated stop only. The list of stops is prepared keeping in view the convenience of all.
6. When the bus is in motion students must not move around in the bus, they should not have any part of their body out of the bus.
7. Objects of any kind must not be discarded or thrown out of the bus.
8. Shrieking, shouting, unruly behaviour is strictly prohibited. Courteous behaviour is expected at all times.
9. The driver's attention must not be distracted for any reason.
10. The bus staff, students and bus monitors are responsible for maintaining discipline in buses. Any serious offence will be reported to the Principal.
11. Every bus will have a attendant responsible for taking attendance in the morning and afternoon.

12. The parents/guardians are responsible to drop/collect the ward at the specified bus stop fixed by the school at the given time, failing which; the ward would have to be dropped/picked-up from the school by the parent/guardians.
13. The bus route once allotted by the school will not be changed before or less than three months.
14. Transport once provided cannot be discontinued during the academic session. In case of discontinuation of the transport facility, no transport would be provided during the next session.
15. In case of a change in address, transportation would be provided only on the availability of the seats which would be effective within ten days and also transport charges will be charged from next quarter.
16. The application for change in the residential address should be submitted one month in advance to the Transport-in-charge. Subsequently, transport will be provided subject to availability of seat in the bus in that particular area in which the school bus is plying. An application after change of residence for adjustment in school transport will not be entertained immediately. It will not be done on availability of seats.


